"Abundance" is the word that best describes the message of today's readings for both Year A (RCIA) and Year C. The Italian word, *abbondanza*, expresses the meaning even better than the English. Today we hear stories of mercy and God's *abbondanza*! This is the week of Psalm 23, "The Lord is My Shepherd" (Year A), and Psalm 34, "Taste and See" (Year C). There is an abundance of selections based on these popular psalms.

For Year A, the Gospel is the story of the man born blind, so consider "Amazing Grace" (BB/MI 428), "Open My Eyes," "You are the Healing," "Be Thou My Vision" (BB/MI 394), and "I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light" (BB/MI 605). For Year C and the Gospel of the prodigal son, see "As We Gather at Your Table," especially verse two: "Give us, Christ, your great compassion to forgive as you forgave." Verse three works well for Year A: "Gracious Spirit, help us summon other guests to share that feast." If you want to try something new and different, see "You Gather in the Outcast." The text by Benedictine Sister Genevieve Glen is accessible and quite harmonically interesting. Verse four reminds us of our call to service.

You may remember the St. Louis Jesuits' 1975 album, *Earthen Vessels*. OCP has released a 40th anniversary edition ([ocp.org/30132344](http://ocp.org/30132344)). On that album is a hidden treasure, "My Son Has Gone Away," Jesuit Father Bob Dufford's tender song about the prodigal son from the father's perspective. It is perfect for today's liturgy, music rehearsal, or religious education programs.

First things first! Daylight saving time starts this weekend. Don't forget to set your clocks. "Spring forward, fall back!" I still don't trust my cellphone to make the change automatically. Some of my time-change anxiety probably comes from the year I forgot to reset my alarm clock. I didn't realize I was late until I walked into the church, where the choir was standing in front of everyone, of course. The liturgy had no accompaniment up to my entry at the Sign of Peace. On top of all that, the pastor told the assembly after his sermon about what he thought might have happened to me. When I appeared in the church doorway, the whole community had a good laugh. I did, too.

Today's Year C Gospel tells the well-known story of the adulterous woman. The good news? The Lenten Scriptures offer two stories with women as centerpieces: the woman at the well and the woman who is being condemned. The bad news? Both are known for their sinfulness, not their virtue. Good Samaritan Sister Verna Holyhead wrote that this Gospel is not about sexual ethics but about Jesus' power to transform people from the inside out (*Welcoming the Word in Year C: With Burning Hearts*, Collegeville: Liturgical Press, 2006, p. 39).

Returning to the topic of forgiveness for a moment, remember that forgiveness does not excuse someone's behavior nor require that we forget what has happened. Neither does it condemn with a sense of superiority. The person does not have to hear how they've wronged us. What forgiveness does mean is abandoning resentment, swallowing pride, letting go of anger. Today's stories tell it all.

Thursday is St. Patrick's Day; next Saturday is St. Joseph's Day.

When preparing today's celebration, keep in mind that not everyone attends the Triduum liturgies. Some of our community members have never participated in the Three Days. For whatever reason, some come only today and return for Easter Sunday Mass. If so, they miss the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Easter Vigil. That's a rather large chapter of the story! That is one reason why the Passion is proclaimed today. Imagine if it weren't!

If the choir is prepared to sing some of the music of Holy Thursday and Good Friday today, then so be it. Although music with texts referring to Christ's crucifixion and death are premature for the First Sunday of Lent, today they are appropriate. "Who Is the Crucified?" is an attractive new choice for today and for Good Friday, too.

The Passion reading—not the triumphal entry—is the centerpiece of today's liturgy. Consider a festive entrance rite that turns solemn for the Liturgy of the Word. There are enough musical selections to suit your needs for the solemn entry. Tom Booth's "Hosanna to the Son of David" ([ocp.org/30127372](http://ocp.org/30127372)) is published by the Spirit & Song division of OCP ([spiritandsong.com](http://spiritandsong.com)). It has an energetic repeated refrain and verses sung by the choir/cantor. It's a great song for competent young adult cantors. At my church, we do an outdoor procession with a cantor leading the song. The choir remains in the church and joins in the music of the assembly when the procession enters the church. No song sheets are necessary. Janet Sullivan Whitaker's bilingual "Hosana/Osana" ([ocp.org/30130003](http://ocp.org/30130003)) was acclaimed at the 2015 NPM convention. 




